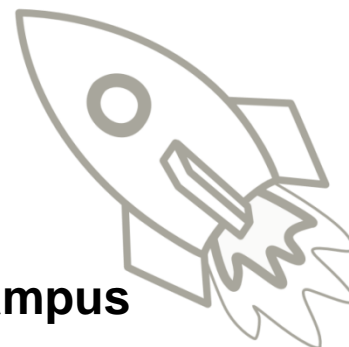

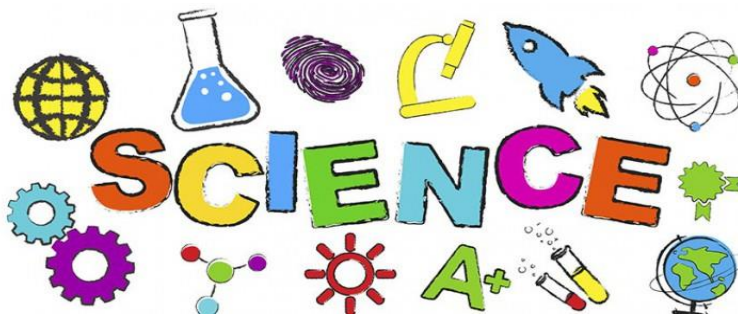

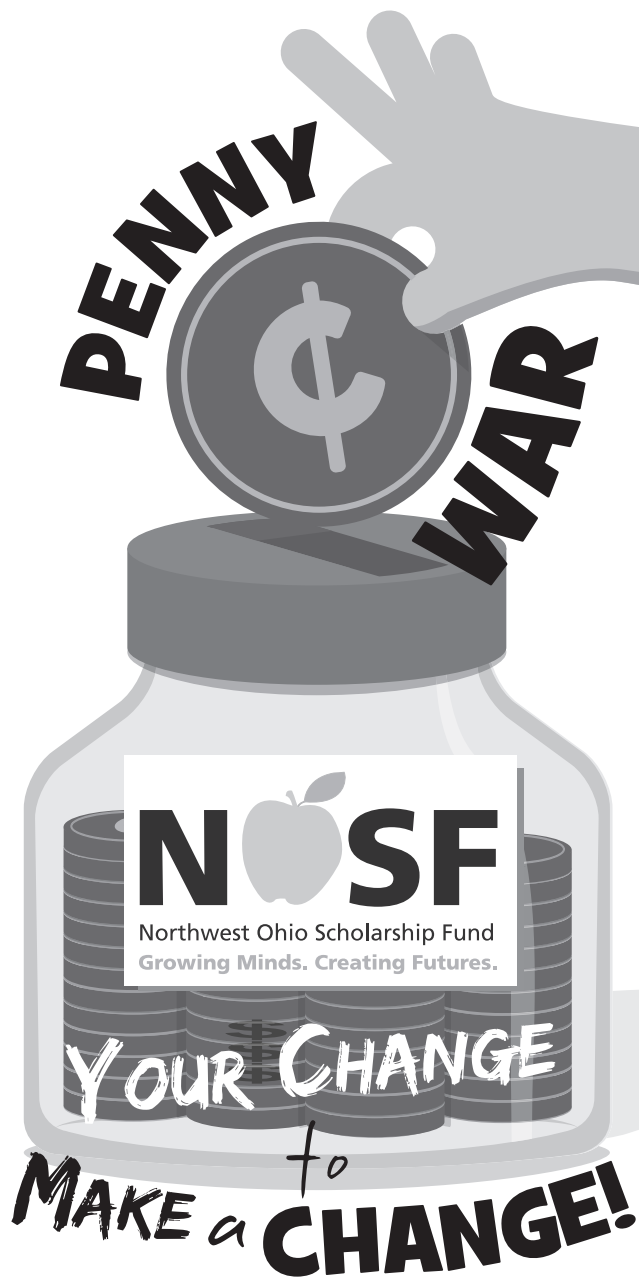
Each grade level will have a drop off box.
