Dear St. Joseph School Parents,

St. Joseph School. The schools of our diocese are called to assist parents in preparing their children to assume their Christian vocation. St. Joseph School enables young children to grow in knowledge, skills, values and attitudes to which they are called by Jesus Christ.

Catholic education at St. Joseph is intended to make students become people of faith who can experience – inside and outside the school setting – learning and living in the light of this faith commitment. Students are instructed in human knowledge and skills in order to best relate human culture to God's plan for evolving creation.

Religious education, i.e., instruction in truths and development of values, is of primary concern. Faith formation at St. Joseph School is not limited to a class period. It is a lived experience five days a weeks, six and one-half hours a day. St. Joseph School enables students to extend their personal faith commitment through prayer and by serving others. Together with faculty and staff, students participate in liturgical activities that foster community. Students explore ways to meet the challenges of tensions and conflicts that occur in community, especially in peacemaking and the achievement of justice. Gospel values impel students to a special concern for all who suffer any disadvantage. Students develop the ability to commit themselves to the public interest by developing the skills and talents needed to contribute to the life of our nation.

Power of the Pen. Power of the Pen is an interscholastic competition in the state of Ohio in creative writing for seventh and eighth grade students. Students compete in three tournaments: District, Regional, and State. The District Competition was held at Timberstone Junior High on January 14. On March 8, over 35 schools from Northwest Ohio with 220 students competed at Lourdes University in the Regional tournament. Students compete individually and as members of six-student teams – one team of seventh grade students and one team of eighth. Our seventh grade Regional qualifiers were Trip Floyd and Robin Johnston. Our eighth grade qualifiers were Maddie Piscopo, Amanda Pawlecki, Kelsey Leamy, Elizabeth Newsom, Grace Hoffman, and Sydney Heerdegen. Elizabeth Newsom place 10th overall and took a Best of the Best Award from the District Competition. Amanda Pawlecki placed 7th overall. The eighth grade team placed second out of 35 eighth grade teams. Amanda Pawlecki and Elizabeth Newsom both

Congratulations to all of our student writers and their moderator-coaches, Mrs. Jessica Jones and Mrs. Molly Lindsley.

Transportation and Dismissal Reminders. The following are reminders of established policy and procedure for transportation and dismissal:

- **Middle School Students.** Drop-off and pick-up for middle school students must be in the official drop-off/pick-up area (east campus parking lot off Main Street). Do not drop off your student from a parking space and allow them to walk through the Main St. east campus parking lot.
- Elementary Students. Students in the elementary building, who are being picked-up after school, may not cross Main Street unless they are accompanied by a parent or parent-designated person.

Pets. I want to remind you that family pets, **especially dogs** ... (I like dogs. We have two - an English Springer Spaniel and a Jack Russell Terrier) may not be brought onto the school campus...not even on a leash. Please understand that this is for the safety of children.





Nova STEM Award


There is tremendous value in learning and having fun at the same time. The Boy Scouts of America developed the Nova Awards program to excite and expand a sense of wonder in our Scouts. By working with an adult counselor, the various modules allow them to explore the basic principles of STEM and discover how fun and fascinating STEM can be.

The Nova STEM program is open to Wolf, Bear and Webelos Scouts. Similar to the religious emblems program, the activities are primarily self-study/do at home with a short review with a counselor. The program incorporates watching a science video/reading a science article, completing an elective adventure and a few additional STEM activities. Upon completion, Scouts are awarded a very cool patch (and recognition pin if earned multiple years).
