General Camp Information

Camp Upham consists of six large cabins and a large dining hall where three nutritious meals are served each day. Campers participate in programs in the large recreation hall, arts and crafts building, and nature building. Convenient showers and bathroom facilities are provided. Camp staff consists of full-time adult paid staff and volunteers along with youth counselors who serve as chaperones, role models, and activity directors. Qualified health personnel are on hand to handle any health or accident incidents. All campers are covered by accident insurance. Visitors are not permitted at camp.

Cabin Mate

Each camper may request on their registration form to have ONE other camper as their cabin mate. Both campers must be in the same grade and list each other on the registration form to ensure the request. Cabin mate requests are not guaranteed but the best part of camp is meeting new friends.
