Divine Calls

Throughout this school year, you've heard of multiple teachers this year receiving 'calls' to go serve in a different school. Just as Jesus called his disciples to follow him, so His church calls workers to serve in the public ministry as teachers and pastors.

So what does it mean when a Mount Olive teacher gets a call to serve at another school or church?

Just like our church has done recently, a group of congregational voters asks for God's wisdom and guidance as they seek to fill a vacancy in their ministry. Through prayer, study, and conversations that group of voters issue a call from God's people for a person to serve among them. When a Mount Olive called teacher receives a call to serve elsewhere, s/he then holds two calls (one to our ministry here, and also one to this other ministry). Teachers do not ask to be called to a different place, and that's why these calls come as a surprise. After receiving the call, they use their God-given wisdom to consider the opportunities to serve in both places and the gifts God has given them, and then pray to God for guidance. Then, s/he decides where to serve, trusting that God will bless that decision; that's why it's called a divine call. From an outside perspective, it seems just like a human organization calling another human to be a worker at their organization. The difference is that we recognize God's presence and hand at work in the whole process, including the ultimate decision, trusting that God will accomplish his purpose in the ministry and his will will be done.

Continue to pray for all of the called workers at Mount Olive as they serve here. When divine calls are issued to our teachers to serve elsewhere, please do not hesitate to reach out and offer encouragement and support to them.

We don't gauge our success on numbers, but rather on the relationships and opportunities we have to spread the Gospel message. - 15 school families taking membership classes, completed membership classes, and/or welcomed into church membership at Mount Olive since August

Athletics Update

Winter Sports are in their final weeks of the season. The FVL Schools principals and FVWAL worked together to put a set of procedures in place to best conduct a Winter Sport season, and so far things as a league have been running smoothly. Winter Sport practices have been held since December 1st, and the first games were played Thursday, January 14 and Friday, January 15 against the Emanuel Tigers.

Forward and ACT Aspire testing
